Flashing Amber Lamp Permit Application

Please refer to Section 4.28 of the Motor Vehicle Act Regulation for more information

***Permits are not required for the following classes of vehicles;**

- a) Emergency vehicles (emergency health Services – Provincial Ambulance Service, Fire Department Vehicles, Police and Peace officer Vehicles);
- b) A tow car while attending or towing a vehicle;
- c) Snow removal equipment (lamp cannot be displayed or used when the vehicle is not being used for snow removal. A magnetic lamp that can be easily removed is suggested), sand spreading equipment or other highway maintenance equipment being used on the highway for the purpose of highway maintenance or construction or for vehicles operating within the confines of a Highway Construction Zone;
- d) An ambulance;
- e) A pilot car, as defined in section 8.02 of BC Reg. 30/78 under the **Commercial Transport Act**, only while escorting an oversize vehicle or load (the lamp or lamps are removed, hooded or turned so that the lens is horizontal to the roof of the vehicle when not in use);
- f) A school bus;
- g) An oversized vehicle or vehicle used to transport oversized loads (must be used in the manner specified in a permit issued under the **Commercial Transport Act**).
