



Bulletin 28 – Free Oversize Overweight Authorization

1. Oversize and overload authorization forms will be used in lieu of our MV4000 Form to permit the movement of vehicles, with or without load, as follows:
 - (a) Indian War Canoes
 - (b) Parade Floats
 - (c) Vehicles for Exhibition purposes at Fairs and Exhibitions
 - (d) Other such vehicles as may be authorized by the Ministry through our Victoria office.
2. This authorization is issued pursuant to Divisions 7.05(1) of the *Commercial Transport Act Regulations* and no fee is to be charged.
3. Forms are valid for the return trip, if so required, and this is to be taken into account when setting out the limitations and conditions on the authorization [Form T-62](#). Note copy attached.
4. Pilot car requirements are applicable.

ADDITIONAL LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

1. **EXTRAORDINARY TRAFFIC:**

This authorization shall in no way be construed as giving permission for the operation of the vehicle on any highway in contravention of any regulations, limitation, or prohibition which may be made from time to time for the protection of the highway pursuant to Section 209 or 210 of the *Motor Vehicle Act*, Section 11 of the *Commercial Transport Act* to Section 24 of the *Highway Act*.

2. **SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION OF AUTHORIZATION:**

If, in the opinion of the Minister, the operation of the vehicle is found to be causing injury or damage to the highway, or is found that the operation of the vehicle is not in the interests of the Public, the Minister may suspend or cancel the authorization.

3. **NOTICE OF SUSPENSION:**

It shall be sufficient notice that the authorization is suspended if such notice is given by the Minister, or by any person authorized by the Minister, verbally or otherwise, to the person owning or to the person driving or operating the vehicle and no formal notice of suspension shall be required.

4. PERMITTEE TO ASSUME LIABILITY:

The Permittee shall be responsible for all damages or injury to any person or persons using the highway or otherwise and for any and all loss or damage to privately owned or Crown property which may result from the operation of the vehicle under the authority of the permit and the Permittee shall protect and save harmless the Attorney General from all loss, damage or injury resulting, directly or indirectly, from the operation of the vehicle.

5. PERMITTEE TO ENSURE VEHICLE SAFETY:

The gross vehicle weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles named herein shall not exceed the safe practical carrying capacity of the vehicle or combination of vehicles or any of the component parts thereof. Permittee shall be responsible for the checking of the vehicle for which this permit is issued to ensure that it is mechanically sound.

6. CONDITIONS OF PERMIT TO BE COMPLETED WITH:

IF AT ANY TIME IT IS FOUND THAT THE VEHICLE IS BEING OPERATED AND DRIVEN AT A GREATER RATE OF SPEED OR HAVING A GREATER GROSS WEIGHT, WEIGHT ON ANY AXLE OR TIRE LOAD, OR HAVING GREATER DIMENSIONS, OR HAVING TIRES OF A SMALLER SIZE OR OF INFERIOR TYPE THAN IS STATED IN THE AUTHORIZATION, THE AUTHORIZATION MAY BE CANCELLED BY ANY PERSON AUTHORIZED BY THE MINISTER WITHOUT FURTHER NOTICE FROM THE MINISTER.
