The Highway 16 Community Transportation Grant Program provides cost-shared funding to establish or expand transportation services for communities from Prince Rupert to Prince George that access Highway 16 for primary services. Funding is available to support capital and operating costs of the proposed transportation. A need for community-based transportation services was identified at

the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure Highway 16 Transportation Symposium held November 24, 2015. Services established with the assistance of this grant program will provide safe transportation options for communities along the Highway 16 corridor, as recommended by the Missing Women Commission of Inquiry, and the Highway of Tears Symposium.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for funding, applications must be received by mail or email (see below), by the October 28, 2016 deadline, and meet the following mandatory requirements:

- Applicant communities (First Nations, Municipalities, and Regional Districts) are to be located along the Highway 16 corridor from Prince Rupert to Prince George.
- Organizations or individuals are to be partnered with an eligible community. Non-profit societies are to be in an eligible community.
- Funding for capital and/or operating costs can be sought to establish new or expand existing community-based transportation services that provide access to primary services such as work, education, health care, social services, banking and shopping.
- Proof of financial commitment (including contributions from funding partners) is required.

ASSESSMENT PROCESS

All eligible applications will be reviewed and assessed on the following criteria:

- The service promotes partnerships between First Nations, industry, businesses, municipalities, regional districts, school boards and nonprofit societies. Applications demonstrating partnership(s) with any of the listed bodies will be preferred.
- Demonstrated need for the program funding and overall strength and feasibility of the proposed plan.

- Size of the catchment area (population served).
- Potential for local employment by industry.
- Extent to which the proposed service meets local needs (tailored services that promote access to work, education, health services, etc.), with the potential to maximize local social or economic benefits.
- Level of coordination (synchronized, flexible schedules) and inter-connectivity of the proposed services between transportation modes (e.g. transit, Northern Health Connections, inter-city bus and rail).
- Inclusivity and accessibility of the proposed service to accommodate youth, seniors and persons with disabilities.

Preference will be given to applicants representing First Nations communities or partnered with First Nations communities, and to remote communities where no services are currently available.

Successful applicants will enter into Conditional Grant Agreements with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure. Proponents are responsible for ensuring that all vehicles are appropriately insured and that drivers and services are properly licensed.

Vehicles must be insured and licensed for commercial use if the driver is compensated or users pay for service. Drivers must hold a valid Class 4 driver's licence to transport 10 or more passengers.

A Passenger Transportation Licence is required for the service if users pay for transportation.

All applicants will be advised of the final decision in writing at the completion of the assessment process.
