Single Trip Overweight Permits - Compliance with Bridge Crossing Conditions

The Ministry of Transportation and Transit (MOTT) issues Single Trip Permits to facilitate movement of heavy non-reducible commodities and to support the economic well-being of the provincial industry. Approximately 60,000 Single Trip Overweight Permits are issued annually. The vast majority of these trucks travel mixed with other traffic on the highways.

Approximately 3500 of these loads (the heaviest ones) are eligible for Single Trip Permits after being evaluated in the Ministry's Extraordinary Load Evaluation process. As part of this process bridge engineers evaluate bridges on the route to determine if they have adequate structural capacity to <u>safely</u> carry the proposed truck load. To get more capacity (efficiency) out of the bridges, thus enabling MOTT to permit industry to use larger and heavier trucks, bridge crossing conditions are applied as required; examples of which include:

- Cross bridge at maximum 10 km/h
- Straddle two lanes (or travel down bridge centerline)
- No other vehicles on the bridge during the truck crossing (e.g. including additional push trucks with the overload vehicle)

Without making use of these bridge crossing conditions to facilitate safe bridge crossings (no bridge collapses), MOTT could not allow the size of trucks currently being issued permits.

These conditions are important because:

- Without them the weight of permit loads would have to be decreased
- They protect the safety of the bridges (no failure)
- They protect the safety of truck drivers
- They protect the economic investment your clients have in the loads you are transporting

PROCEDURE

All Extraordinary Load Approvals where bridge crossing conditions are present will require the carrier to have a valid Form CVSE1053, signed by an authorized company officer, on file at the Provincial Permit Centre, prior to obtaining permits. These forms are valid from the date of signing to December 31st of the current year. Forms received in December will be deemed valid to December 31st of the following year.
